

## **SPORTING ACTIVITIES CONSENT**

## This agreement is effective for the duration of the student/s enrolment at Gin Gin State High School

Students have the opportunity to participate in representative / interschool or recreational sporting activities in summer or winter. These Sports will be held on Wednesday afternoon at various locations around Bundaberg.

The school is a member of the Bundaberg District and Wide Bay region and fields representative school teams that compete against other schools. For Years 7 – 12, this can involve weekly bus travel to neighbouring schools or off-campus sporting facilities. Summer Season interschool sports include touch football, basketball, volleyball, tennis & tenpin bowling. Winter Season interschool sports include netball, rugby league, football, lawn bowls and tenpin bowling.

The school also utilizes various venues in the community and utilises the expertise of a number of outside instructors. Some of these activities involve students travelling by bus or walking off-campus under the supervision of teachers. During Physical Education, students may have access to a variety of activities such as swimming and golf as well as engaging in programs requiring use of the school gym for curricular purposes.

Weekly sports selections (interschool or recreational) will be available for parents to view on their student's timetable and online via Q Parents.

During the year, students also participate in special athletic events including Athletics Carnival (off-campus), Swimming Carnival (involving bus travel), and Cross-Country Carnival (where students may navigate a course that goes outside the school boundary, under the supervision of teachers).

## **Activity Risks & Insurance**

The activities outlined above carry an inherent risk of physical injury occurring. Please note that the Department of Education, does not have personal accident insurance cover for students. If your child is injured as a result of an accident or incident, all costs associated with the injury, including medical costs are the responsibility of the parent/carer. Some incidental medical costs may be covered by Medicare. If you have private health insurance, some costs may also be covered by your provider. Any other costs must be covered by parents/carers. It is up to all parents/carers to decide what types and what level of private insurance they wish to arrange to cover their child. Please take this into consideration when deciding whether or not to allow your child/children to participate in these activities.
